



## Pamela Kelley Hull

June 26, 1928 - November 10, 2021

Pamela Kelley Hull died peacefully at home, surrounded by her family, after a short illness on Wednesday, November 10, 2021. Pam was born to Daphne Field and Russell P. Kelley in Lake Forest on June 26, 1928. She was the granddaughter of Sara and Stanley Field and Lillian and William V. Kelley. She was preceded in death by her husband Roger B. She served as a Life Trustee of The Field Museum and a Life Director of The Chicago Botanic Garden. She was a member of the Old

Masters' Society and The Antiquarian Society of The Art Institute of Chicago. Pam's garden in Lake Forest was accepted into The Garden Club of America's Archives of American Gardens Collection at the Smithsonian Institution. She also served on the Vestry of The Church of the Holy Spirit. She was happiest in her garden, either alone or hosting a party. Her kindness, generosity and elegance were cherished and will be missed by all.
