



Ryne Dee Sandberg

September 18, 1959 - July 28, 2025

On July 28, 2025, this world lost a man of great character, principle and -- above all -- love. Ryne Sandberg -- the father of five and No. 23 -- departed at 5:23 p.m., having offered everything he had to his wife, his children, his grandchildren, the game of baseball, the Chicago Cubs and the City of Chicago.

But it would be a grand disservice if he was remembered only because of his baseball talent. In truth, he was a Hall of Fame husband, father, grandfather and friend, a man who cared deeply for those in his life, and those he encountered in his travels. Just as he played the game of baseball, his devotion to all that he loved is what truly defined him. He lived to please others. He lived to be with others. He lived to love others.

In good times and bad, his wife Margaret sustained him and helped him to find his true happiness. His children, B.R., Adriane, Lindsey, Justin and Steven, buoyed him. His 11 grandchildren lifted him to heights he never dreamed of as an athlete.

His life in baseball, which occupied so many decades as player and manager, gave way to a new life, one of freedom, family and friends, filled with happiness and goals of a different kind, the kind outside public life -- and a focus only on joy, of watching little ones dance in recitals, of watching children

play soccer, lacrosse, football, basketball and baseball.

Block parties and neighborhood events in the Chicago suburbs were suddenly the norm, where a superhero could mingle as mere mortal, a gift he could have never envisioned receiving even a few years prior, but one that kept on giving to the end, a sense of belonging and community that was in turn so comforting.

Ryne Dee Sandberg, 65, of humble and quiet beginnings, lived a full and remarkable life. The smalltown kid from Spokane, Washington, was in the end as he always was, smiling, joking and unassuming -- as God made him and kept him. Devoted husband of Margaret (nee Facio); beloved father of B.R. (Katie), Adriane, Lindsey (Adam), Justin (Ashley) and Steven (Megan); deeply adored pappi of Joshua, Owen, Micah, Nathan, Eli, Brooklyn, Weston, Stella, Bode, Roman and Adylan. He is survived by sister Maryl (Tom) and brother Del (Julie), and preceded in death by parents Derwent and Elizabeth, and brother Lane.
